

This convocation will go down in history as the cornerstone for many future graduating classes of the University, ensuring the firm resolve of the University in delivering academic excellence across all branches of knowledge. Closing the year was the birth anniversary of Quaid-e-Azam and Christmas, symbolizing the pledge to contribute to building a brighter future for all Pakistanis irrespective of caste and creed. RWU MILESTONES

First Convocation of Rawalpindi Women University Marks a Historic Milestone

October 01, 2024: Rawalpindi Women University (RWU) celebrated its first convocation with pride, marking a historic milestone in its academic journey. The event was held with great enthusiasm and attended by Hon'ble Chancellor & Governor Punjab, Sardar Saleem Haider Khan, as the chief guest, and Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed, Chairman of the Higher Education Commission, as the guest of honor.

Vice Chancellor Prof. Dr. Anila Kamal, the founding Vice Chancellor of the university, presented a comprehensive report highlighting RWU's rapid progress in a short span. She shared with pride that the university was ranked 36th in Social Responsibility and 16th in Industrial Applications in the World University Rankings for Innovation (WURI), placing it among the top 100 innovative institutions worldwide.

At the convocation, degrees were awarded to a total of 847 graduating students from the Faculty of Science and the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. Ten students were awarded gold medals, nine received silver medals, thirteen students earned certificates of distinction for securing third and fourth positions, and twenty-six students were recognized on the Roll of Honor. Governor Punjab personally distributed the medals and certificates among the high achievers.

In his address, Hon'ble Chancellor Sardar Saleem Haider Khan congratulated the graduating students, their families, and teachers, emphasizing the significance of the moment as the university's first convocation. He highlighted that education plays a central role in the development of nations and underscored the importance of women's education in preserving cultural and societal values. He noted that educating women is vital for creating a balanced society and that teachers have a dual responsibility of imparting knowledge and nurturing character. He remarked that Pakistan, being the only Muslim country with nuclear power, has the potential to lead the Islamic world but peace and stability are essential for this vision. He expressed hope that the youth will unite the nation and defeat any conspiracy that aims to divide it. Reflecting on Pakistan's academic development, he pointed out that there was only one university at the time of independence, whereas today there are 265, which is a positive sign of national progress.

Chairman Higher Education Commission, Prof. Dr. Mukhtar Ahmed (S.I), in his address, acknowledged the role of HEC in expanding access to higher education. He informed the audience that when HEC was established, there were only 51 universities in the country, and as of 2024, the number has grown to 265. He appreciated the growing participation of women in higher education and noted that universities across Pakistan are offering a wide range of programs. He also highlighted that the country is now publishing approximately 40,000 research papers annually, which reflects a growing focus on research and academic contribution.

The convocation concluded with a strong sense of achievement, national pride, and optimism for the future. The outstanding performance of students like Ayesha Shaheen, Arooba Aurangzeb Mughal, Mehreen Naz, Hafiza Ayesha Nadeem, Haleema Khatoon, Ayesha Rabab, Saharish Batool, Iqra Tahir, Komal Altaf, and Anaba Khan, who received gold medals, stood as a proud reminder of RWU's commitment to excellence, women empowerment, and academic leadership.

IQC Meeting Highlights Institutional Quality Drive

December 12, 2024: Rawalpindi Women University (RWU) held its 1st Institutional Quality Circle (IQC) meeting, chaired by the Vice Chancellor and attended by departmental and administrative heads. The Director QEC presented the agenda, focusing on key initiatives to enhance academic and administrative standards.

The discussion included defining the role of IQC in institutional quality enhancement and launching the Programme Review for Effectiveness and Enhancement (PREE)/Self-Assessment Report (SAR), with a deadline of February 15, 2025. It was decided to schedule the RIPE review for April–May 2025 in line with HEC standards.

Other key matters included the discussion of the SCALE policy to promote student engagement in quality processes, aligning departmental strategic plans with RWU's vision and mission, and planning PhD NOC submissions to HEC for Spring 2025. The proposal to introduce an online student grievance portal was also presented.

Additionally, the formation of committees for RIPE, SAR, and quality follow-up was agreed upon. The Vice Chancellor concluded the meeting by encouraging sustained commitment to continuous quality improvement at RWU.







Meeting of Syndicate

December 17, 2024: The 10th meeting of the RWU Syndicate was chaired by the Minister for Higher Education, Punjab, Mr. Rana Sikandar Hayat, and attended by representatives of various Government departments, including HED, Law, Finance, HEC, PHEC, and the Provincial Assembly of Punjab. The eminent members appointed by the Chancellor, including Maj. Gen. (R) Malik Muhammad Masud, HI (M), Syed Tahir Shahbaz (PAS), Mr. Sohail Altaf, Dr. Shabnum Sarfaraz, and Dr. Aliya H. Khan, were also part of Augustus House. The Syndicate accorded approval of the University's budget for FY 2024-25, including the hiring of personnel for teaching and non-teaching positions, the academic council's recommendations, and the adoption of GoPs policies for pension and the GP Fund.



Nanocoatings for Energy Applications



Today, I work with international clients, runs my own initiatives, and serve as a mentor for aspiring tech professionals. From my early days of uncertainty to becoming a role model in IT and design, my story is not just one of success — it's one of transformation, empowerment, and breaking boundaries.
